SANDUSKY COUNTY HISTORY

The cannon "Old Betsy" is Sandusky County's most unique symbol of the past. This single cannon was used by Major George Croghan's successful defense of Fort Stephenson during the War of 1812. She presently sits on the site of Fort Stephenson near Major Croghan's final resting place in Fremont.

Lying on the western edge of the "Firelands" in northwest Ohio, Sandusky County was created in 1820 from Huron County Ohio. Fremont, once known as Lower Sandusky, is the county seat. The adjoining counties of Seneca and Ottawa were part of Sandusky County until 1824 and 1840 respectively.

Sandusky County's most distinguished citizen of the past is Rutherford B. Hayes, 19th President of the United States.

The Rutherford B. Hayes Presidential Library and Museums was the first Presidential Library established in the U.S.. The library's interest in genealogy stems from Hayes himself who, as early as 1860, was writing entries in his journals regarding his search for his antecedents. Today this library is a major research center for northwestern Ohio, having collections and resources far beyond President Hayes and the Sandusky County area. Affiliated with the Ohio Historical Society the use of the library is free. Call for current hours.

The Rutherford B. Hayes Presidential Library contains many research sources for Sandusky County and beyond. Cemetery Records, many Ohio County printed histories, Sandusky County Probate & Will records (original packets 1820-1894), plus a one of a kind obituary file indexed and available online.
